

ANARCHISTS LOSE APPEAL.

New England Group of Italian Reds Will Be Deported.

BOSTON, June 4.—A group of leading New England anarchists lost their fight today against being deported when Judge Aldrich in the United States District Court denied their petitions for writs of habeas corpus. The men to be deported are:

Luigi Galleanunni of Wrentham, editor of an anarchist paper in Lynn; Giuseppe Frizzetti of Bridgewater; Ernesto R. Penella of New London, Conn.; Giuseppe Solari of East Boston; Togardo Montanari of Hyde Park; Vincenzo de Lecca of Athol; Francisco de Santis of Boston; Globbe Sanchini of New Britain, Conn.; Alphonse Fagotti of Boston; Raffaelli Schinini of Lynn, and Irma Sanchini of New Britain, Conn.

Galleanunni is said to have been arrested under the Enemy Trading act and fined \$250. Schinini was sentenced to a year's imprisonment for failing to register under the Selective Draft act.

The men admitted, it is said, that they were anarchists, but asserted that they did not advocate violence against organized government. They were termed "philosophical anarchists" by their attorneys.

Judge Aldrich said:

"The point is taken by the petitioners' counsel that they are only philosophical anarchists who do not teach violence, but this point only goes to the degree of offensiveness and cannot be accepted as an answer to the authority of the executive branch of the Government to deport."
